

Overall responsibility for your Sub – Camp, supported by your team of assistant subcamp leaders.

Manage budget to support Sub – Camp infrastructure.

To arrange/organise Sub – Camp Gateway & Flag.

Together with the Programme Lead formulate a rota for main activities during daytime programme. (Re: Site activities - a separate person will be coordinating these).

Involved in individual Groups' camp site location and layout of subcamp, including marking out Group camping areas.

On Camp: a) Attend daily morning briefings and disseminate programme plans for the day to Group Leaders. b) Together with the Programme Lead, ensure any Group Leaders responsible for running camp activities are in place at the relevant time.
