Bring warm outdoor clothing and shoes as some of the sessions will take place on an outdoor archery range.



## Census 2024.

At the start of each year, we hold our annual Census. Our Census gives us key information about our membership figures and the frameworks that support them.

This year, we're bringing the timeline forward. We're going to send your passwords in early December to help you prioritise the Census before you focus on adopting the new volunteer experience changes in the new year. Please start collecting your youth membership figures (and particularly your diversity data) now, so we can get a better picture of how well we represent our local communities.

For 2024, we'd like you to complete your Census based on the day in January you complete your return, rather than 31 January. As we prepare to move to our new digital system, any adult data needed to support the Census should be taken from Compass before the 1 February. In our update, you'll see the updated timelines and learn why some of the data we ask for is so important.

The updated national timeline will look as follows:

- Between 6 and 13 December Census passwords sent out
- 20 December The Census site opens
- Census accurate as per the date in January you complete your return.
- 14 January Census approvals open
- 1 February Deadline for data needed from compass for Census
- 14 February Census closes nationally all returns must be complete and approved

Your local Commissioner will set the deadline for when you need to have complete and approved your section, group and district returns locally.
