Normandy - 80 Years- Commemorations

80 years ago, on the 6th June 1944 an armada of ships left UK ports bound for the beaches of Normandy with soldiers and their equipment from the free world, their objective to liberate the countries of Europe.

To achieve liberation there was a sense of duty to one's own country and the peoples of Europe, just reflect on our Scout Promise "On my honour I promise I will do my best and do my duty to God and the King.

On that day in June 1944, 1,475 British servicemen and two Nursing Sisters laid down their lives by doing their duty for their country and ultimately for the freedom of Europe, the Nursing Sisters, Evershed and Field saved 70 men from a sinking Hospital ship and this is also reflected in our Scout Promise "to help other people at all times."

On Thursday 6th June this year there will be many commemorations here in the UK, Europe and worldwide for the 80th Anniversary so I would ask you to just spare a thought on the day to remember the servicemen and service women who did not make it back. Those taking part won the day, and approximately 12 months later PEACE returned to Europe.


I will leave you with the last two lines of the song "NORMANDY" compose by Jim Radford who was there on that day in 1944.

Brenda had an eye for detail when she typed up the District's Executive minutes and reports, she organised the Executive's Agenda, plus arranged the Warrants Committee for new leader interviews and also kept a record of all the Leader warrants renewal dates, nothing escaped her attention, she had a logical mind and put it to good use. Unfortunately for scouting the likes of Brenda or no longer available and scouting is poorer for it.

Brenda lost her first husband but within the bond of scouting she married Tom Gregory the GSL of the 6th Ashton and they scouted together, you would find them both at many District events helping to run the administrative side, marshalling the scouts taking part and keeping the scores, always done cheerfully and once again correctly.

In her younger days Brenda was a member of the YHA Group in Ashton and with other members of the Group, Brenda hiked the length and breadth of the Peak District over many enjoyable weekends. Brenda loved nothing more than to put on her hiking boots and walk miles in the countryside around Manchester, she was an excellent hiker and kept up quite easily with other members on their expeditions. The promoter of the 7th Stalybridge Scout Group Lottery is David Hewitt (Treasurer). 7th Stalybridge Scout Group is licensed and regulated in Great Britain by Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council under license number GASLOT240225. Players must be 18 or over. A minimum of 50% of the total lottery proceeds go to supporting the work carried out by 7th Stalybridge Scout Group, 45% on prizes and 5% on expenses and administration of the lottery.
