Obituary - GONE HOME

Danny Oliver Jones

Danny Jones District Commissioner - North Tameside from 1985 until 1994.

Prior to becoming District Commissioner Danny was GSL of the 2nd Ashton, the Group was always close to his heart even after his promotion, the 2nd Ashton was not only part of his life but also his wife's Linda who was a Rainbow Guide Leader and his two sons Bryn and Gareth, one of which gained the Queen's Scout Award something Danny was very proud of, you could also say they were a family of service not just for Scouting and Guiding but for the local community.

Like all new District Commissioners in any Scout District, Danny set about reorganising the District's Scout team, I was privileged to be asked to become ADC Scouts and there were other positional changes to the Scouting District Team as well.

Danny took the District through many changes, not least the launch of the Beaver Section in 1986, a section which still flourishes today. Under his guidance we held three District open days, two in Audenshaw and one in Stamford Park and who can forget the Scout Associations "Willy Woggle" scheme, besides all the other scouting section activities taking place.

Danny always supported the District and its Scout Leaders through thick and thin, they would bring their problems to him and more often than not go away well satisfied with their problems resolved. Wherever Danny was in the District, he always had a word for the youngest Beaver to the oldest Scout, giving them confidence for the future.

In 1994 Danny applied for a full position in the Scout Association and was successful in becoming the Area Commissioner for scouting in the North East of England where he settled with Linda until he retired, he must have done a good job because at his funeral two Scout Leaders travelled all the way down from Newcastle to pay their last respects.

Danny and his family had high Christian values, it is a sad loss for scouting and certainly for his family, there will not be many more like Danny Jones in this world of ours,

So, rest easy Danny your suffering is now over, you are in better place and in the hands of God.
